In the future, it would be beneficial to spend less time discussing the "math behind statistics" and more time in the lab. I'd say half and half, if not more time in the lab. We end up feeling rushed and just trying to get things done in time (or stay after) in the lab, although it does seem to be the time we most feel we are learning applicable things. I liked how in first semester, we used the same data and got to feel like we were working towards something. It would be similar to a process of thesis work, and made us actually want to find out what worked (or maybe that was just me). I think the time spent in class/lab plus the hours per week we spend on homework should be an appropriate amount of time and not affect our grades. It has been apparent (or maybe assumed) that grades are higher for those who go see Robb weekly outside of class, regardless of actual work submitted. 



- Robb has been a great professor. He really cares about the subject matter and his student's learning and understanding of it.
- I really enjoyed how the labs were based off of our assignments. I felt that this allowed for full comprehension of the material while also limiting the amount of time we had to spend running analyses for our assignment. I wish more statistics courses had a lab component like this
- I've had many thoughts regarding this class throughout the semester. I want to say some things honestly without being biased by some frustrations. Robb is a great instructor, loves stats, and cares about how we do. However, I think there's some improvements that need to happen in the future.

The amount of time spent on outside work for this class is more than seems reasonable. Besides having the 3 hour class and 1 hour lab, we spend hours working on 1. A draft and 2. A revision every single week. On top of this, it's implicitly expected that we meet with Robb outside of class to get help on the drafts. This is not just coming from me but from every conversation I've had regarding the class so far - if we cannot do the assignments well from what we learn in class and in the lab, we aren't learning enough in class. There may be a case of a specific student struggling who needs extra help, but it's become clear that if we don't come for those extra meetings, it's as if we aren't doing the expected minimum.

I also think there's a lot of wasted time in the lecture. Often we spend time talking about the mechanics behind what SPSS does, or how different models are similar, or how you can find things using different formulas. I understand the importance of this background information. However, often it feels like an information overload. We don't talk about the weekly assignments until we get to the lab (even though our entire grade is based on that assignment), so we spend that 3 hours learning things that aren't directly applicable or helpful for the grades/assignments.

We also don't spend nearly enough time in class discussing how things should be written up. When our entire grade is based on a written assignment, we should have more guidance on how to write correctly. When discussing this with another research methods professor it was said "Well, there's a lot of wrong and right ways to right something. He needs to be showing you the right way." And I agree. When we get papers back and there's "not enough explanation", "missing limitations", etc.: it should be clear that we aren't learning this in class. At all.

Two assignments a week is a lot of work. On top of the 4 hour class. On top of meeting outside of class.

I've also heard from many students (and agree) that some of the things you say about our efforts can be hurtful. Often we have comments like "seems like you're distracted, come see me", or "It's clear you've had a busy week", or "you would benefit from putting more time into this", it seems kind of insensitive. Yes, we are distracted, busy, and could use more time. But we are doing the best we can and honestly feel like we can't do well with just our best.

I feel like I've learned so much about stats from this semester. Honestly. And I really enjoy the class. But it's often not reflected in the grades, because the assignments and the class don't align.

I've said this before and I've heard it from everyone else: we should get what we need to do fairly well IN class, and take it a step further on our own. If we can turn in a draft, meet with Robb, and still not get an A - that is reflective of what we learned about it from Robb as well. Again, I think Robb is fantastic. But the assignments should reflect what we do in class - not be a whole new thing to be learned in just the hour of lab and mostly outside of class. I think everyone would benefit from learning more about the writing aspect and interpretation of these things in class rather than the minute details of what goes on behind the scenes in SPSS.

I liked how lab assignments were our homework assignments this semester. I think this was helpful because it provided a clear understanding of what we needed to do for the assignments, and we could go over any questions about the assignment with Robb in the lab.
