Sometimes, I felt that I had given you what the assignment sheet asked for, but my grade did not reflect that. It seemed as if you wanted more. I would suggest just making that clear from the beginning by putting it on the assignment sheet. There may be less rewrites.

2 Rob is incredibly dedicated to helping students understand the material (which is really very dense!). Great learning environment.

Rob is a gentle and patient instructor. He goes out of his way to help students understand what for many is a very difficult topic. His assignments (i.e., reading, homework) are clear and provide good opportunities for students to learn and apply course material. His quizzes are generally a fair assessment. However, he does expect students to memorize things (e.g., standards of interpretation for correlations, effect sizes; equations) that they would have access to in every day life. My own advisor doesn't know these things off the top of their head, and Rob, himself, references these things in class. I find this to be a poor assessment and would prefer quizzes with more application and less recall. The other thing which served as a barrier to learning in this class was the use of SASS. No one in the class uses SASS in their own labs or had experience using it. This meant that half of the battle in learning the statistical test was navigating a strange and slightly complicated utility. This also constituted a barrier to doing the assignments because I had to be on campus in the grad lab to complete the homework rather than at home (where I have SPSS, that I paid for, on my personal computer) or in my lab space (where I do most of my work). This seems kind of diva, but because I had to do assignments in a place I rarely go, this meant that I had to make intentional plans to spend large portions of my day in the grad lab rather than working on the assignment in chunks (which I would have preferred). In consulting with other graduate students, many of them do not use SASS in their labs in the Department, so I am not sure of the rational behind using the utility over SPSS (which is more widely used and more readily available).

- 4 It would have been beneficial to be extra clear with what was expected on assignments. Often, I would get my assignments back to find that I hadn't included something and been penalized for it even though it was not specified in the assignment.
- I loved this course! Robb is a great instructor and does a great job at making a challenging, and somewhat boring, subject enjoyable. You can tell he cares about how well the students are learning the material. He was clear in what he expected from us each week and it made completing the assignments a lot easier. I cannot wait to take his class again in the Spring. Go STATS!:)
- 6 I felt like we could have used more examples in class with different scenarios. It was somewhat difficult for me to generalize the information to our assignments since I only saw it in the context of the one type of example in class.
- Having 3 papers due and a quiz all on the same day is too much. Rob needs to find a way to avoid situations like that. I feel like on quiz days no papers should be due. For majority of the semester the assignments were pretty well spread out. I also think for a lot of the reflection readings it would make more sense to have us to one comment per reading rather than two because most of us were bullshitting to try to invent something to have a reaction to. I also wish he would have squashed the "stats is so easy, yall are so stupid, how do yall not understand this" talk that constantly came from one student particularly directed at one other student. It was bothersome and it happened every single week.
