
6 Mr. Bubb was one of the best teachers I've had at Auburn so far. He made sure the class understood the material.

7 More feedback on tests would be great. Instead of seeing what question I got wrong I wish there was a way to see the exact question and what I answered.



1	Very challenging course with a very dedicated and effective teacher.
2	The flipped classroom model is challenging in this context. Students are graded on the accuracy of the homework when the content has not been taught yet. It can be very discouraging.
	Another challenge is that students are expected to have taken multiple statistics courses before taking this course. However, the courses are not pre-requisites. It leaves students feeling confused and frustrated.
3	Rob is a fantastic instructor and his availability outside of class is life-saving. The course itself seemed to be very fast-paced and it was a struggle trying to keep up with all of the material. In regards to writing the paper, I think it would be very helpful to spend more time in SPSS during class.
4	Rob designed the class to have just enough challenge and just enough mercy (i.e. tough quizzes on a curve). I was very encouraged the learn the material and perform well, without feeling too overwhelmed or like it was unmanageable. The content of the course was tough and at times difficult to keep up with, but overall I think Rob did a great job helping us do our best while not making things easy. I especially appreciated how he designed the paper to result our final grade after many revisions, not our first drafts. It was a great way to learn!

6	I thought this class had a lot of difficult content to grasp in a short period of time, but I do not think that lies on the fault of the professor. It was a lot of heavy material to know and hard to sit through for 3 hours. I know most graduate classes are 1 day per week, but I think even separating this class into 2 day, 1.5-hour classes could help immensely. I thought Rob did a great job of teaching and being accessible for help regularly. You can really tell he cares about his students and wants them to succeed.
7	Dr. Bubb is an incredible professor. He is extremely kind and really cares about his students and their success. I am so excited to have had the opportunity to learn from him!
8	Dr. Bubb is an effective and approachable instructor. He is a great teacher and an absolute asset to Auburn University. There is a slight unbalance in the class. I believe that there is not enough applied theory of research methods to be effective. We do our paper, which brings a lot of pressure. Homework could include a few more applied research questions that require us to use SPSS. I do not feel comfortable using SPSS on my own after this course. That being said, Dr. Bubb is great and we all love him!

A statistics class should be listed as a pre-requisite for this course. With no stats background I felt like I started in the negative and just muddled my way through.
The reading worksheets were helpful to gain a better understanding of the material that would be covered in class, but it was frustrating to be graded for accuracy on something that I had not yet learned.

It would be helpful to get the RW's back before the quiz that covers those particular weeks. Understanding the instructor's thoughts and approach in combination with how I answered questions would have been beneficial for my learning style.

9 The quiz format was a struggle for my learning style. Especially without a stats background, interpreting questions on a timer with no resources was practically impossible for me. A take-home quiz format could save precious class time, while allowing for a more practical application of resources and knowledge.

The Huck book was expensive and rarely used. I dug around and found a less expensive option, but requiring a book that expensive and then not utilizing it was a frustration. The book itself was not helpful and hard to read. The By Design book was much more accessible. The articles assigned were also helpful. I would suggest finding articles that cover the material in the Huck book and not require it as a text.

The instructor is very personable and available for students to discuss assignments or concerns. He obviously cares about seeing students succeed and leaving class with a better understanding of research methods.


- Instructure tried to help students really understand the "why" not just the "how" of the content.
